COVID-19 Vaccination

Interested in scheduling a COVID-19 vaccination in Charlotte County?

COAD Florida stands for "Community Organization Active in a Disaster." Pastor Devon has been sitting in on meetings for the COAD Food Task Force for Charlotte County since April 2020. In the meeting held on Tuesday, January 5, a representative from COAD talked about how people are receiving the vaccination.

Here are the key components:

- 1. Every Wednesday morning at 9am, the website opens for those in Charlotte County and allows people to register to get the vaccine the following week. Visit https://www.coadfl.org to sign up to receive the vaccine as soon as you desire and can get an appointment.

 - -According to the governor's executive order, the priority population for the initial phases of the vaccine will go to:
 - -Long-term care facility residents and staff
 - -Persons 65 years of age and older
 - -Health care personnel with direct patient contact
 - -Hospital providers may vaccinate persons who they deem to be extremely vulnerable to COVID-19.




If you were not able to join us for in person worship on Sunday, and would like a Star Word (or Gift) please let Pastor Devon ASAP! We will drop them in the mail this week!

Here is a little theological background on "Star Words." The creators of our theme "Those Who Dream" share these insights:

- 1. The Magi followed a star, which ultimately led them to Jesus. Therefore, we too use all the resources we have available to us—including creative prayer practices and intention words for the new year—to move closer to Jesus.
- 2. We trust that God uses multiple ways to guide us and speak to us. Star words are one such lens that might provide us a way to look for God in our midst, both actively and in hindsight.
- 3. We trust that it is often easy to miss God in our daily midst. Having an intention word to consider both in present days, as well as to reflect on at the end of the year, allows for us to see God in ways we may not have seen God before. This is the greatest gift.
- 4. We know that the most common prayer practice for many involves speaking to God as opposed to silence or contemplation. We believe that star words invite a new prayer rhythm of reflection and review that can be a powerful new way to connect with God.
- 5. By not looking or sorting through the star words at their selection, we practice the spiritual task of receiving. It is not we who are in control in this moment. Instead, we trust that God is present, and we let go of our desire to cultivate or control.



"One August afternoon, two sisters—Sophia, eight, and Alyona, eleven—go missing from a beach on the far-flung Kamchatka Peninsula in northeastern Russia. Taking us through the year that follows, Disappearing Earth enters the lives of women and girls in this tightly knit community who are connected by the crime: a witness, a neighbor, a detective, a mother. We are transported to vistas of rugged beauty—open expanses of tundra, soaring volcanoes, dense forests, the glassy seas that border Japan and Alaska—and into a region as complex as it is alluring, where social and ethnic tensions have long simmered, and where outsiders are often the first to be accused. In a story as propulsive as it is emotionally engaging, Julia Phillips's powerful novel brings us to a new understanding of the intricate bonds of family and community, in a Russia unlike any we have seen before."
