In the spirit of Wintergarden Presbyterian's mission, the food pantry has continued to put their all into making sure no one goes hungry in Charlotte County. We have become the largest food pantry in the county, serving approximately 250 families, or 1100 people, every Thursday. We've also been blessed with the opportunity to participate in the Care and Share program. Care and Share provides shelf stable food to individuals 60 and up, on a recurring monthly basis. Over the first few months, we have a great start with over 100 boxes given out every month, and many more clients asking to be added!


THE BOOK OF



JULY: Five Quarters of the Orange by Joanne Harris (307 pages)

Framboise Simon returns to the French village where she lived as a girl during the German occupation. As she returns to her home on the banks of the Loire, the locals do not recognize her as the daughter of the infamous Mirabelle Dartigen – the woman they still hold responsible for a terrible tragedy that took place during the time of the German occupation decades earlier. Although Franboise hopes for a new beginning, she quickly discovers that past and present are inextricably intertwined. Nowhere is this truth more apparent than in the scrapbook of recipes she has inherited from her dead mother.

With this book Framboise re-creates her mother's dishes, which she serves in her small creperie. And yet as she studies the scrapbook – searching for clues to unlock the contradiction between her mother's sensuous love of food and often cruel demeanor – she begins to recognize a deeper meaning behind Mirabelle's cryptic scribbles. Within the journal's tattered pages lies the key to what actually transpired the summer Franboise was nine years old.

AUGUST: Before the Coffee Gets Cold by Toshikazu Kawaguchie (272 pages)

In a small back alley of Tokyo, there is a café that has been serving carefully brewed coffee for more than one hundred years. Local legend says that this shop offers something else besides coffee—the chance to travel back in time.

Over the course of one summer, four customers visit the café in the hopes of making that journey. But time travel isn't so simple, and there are rules that must be followed. Most important, the trip can last only as long as it takes for the coffee to get cold.

Heartwarming, wistful, mysterious and delightfully quirky, Toshikazu Kawaguchi's internationally bestselling novel explores the age-old question: What would you change if you could travel back in time?

SEPTEMBER: Sunflower Sisters by Martha Hall Kelly

Kelly tells the story of her ancestor Georgeanna Woolsey, a Union nurse who joins the war effort during the Civil War, and how her calling leads her to cross paths with

Inspired by true accounts, Sunflower Sisters provides a vivid, detailed look at the Civil War experience, from the barbaric and inhumane plantations, to a war-torn New York City to the horrors of the battlefield. It's a sweeping story of women caught in a country on the brink of collapse, in a society grappling with nationalism and unthinkable racial cruelty, a story still so relevant today.

OCTOBER: Nomadland, Surviving America in the Twenty-First Century by Jessica Bruder (288 pages)

From the beet fields of North Dakota to the campgrounds of California to Amazon's CamperForce program in Texas, employers have discovered a new, low-cost labor pool, made up largely of transient older adults. These invisible casualties of the Great Recession have taken to the road by the tens of thousands in RVs and modified vans, forming a growing community of nomads.

Nomadland tells a revelatory tale of the dark underbelly of the American economy - one which foreshadows the precarious future that may await many more of us. At the same time, it celebrates the exceptional resilience and creativity of these Americans who have given up ordinary rootedness to survive, but have not given up hope.
